Researcher's Manual:

[or the "ten (research) commandments"]

- 1. Which table/figure am I working on today (and this week)?
- 2. Which <u>relevant paper(s)</u> should I read today (and this week)?
- 3. Compose a sequence of figures/tables that summarizes the <u>'story'</u> (or the "bottom line") of the paper.
- 4. Describe the content of each table/figure, including similarities/differences with respect to the available literature.
- 5. Write the Methodology (experimental/theoretical) section.
- 6. Based on #4 above, write a complete version of the R&D section.
- 7. Finalize the list of references and, based on it, decide on the most appropriate journal for this paper.
- 8. Write the Introduction.
- 9. Write the Abstract and the Conclusions.
- 10. Circulate complete draft among co-authors/colleagues.
